#### REVIEW AND RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

The company is pleased to announce a 31% increase in half-year profit for the six months ended December 2001 compared to the same period in 2000. Net profit of \$2.109 million was achieved on revenue of \$4.877 million, which represents revenue growth of 15.8%. Earnings per share rose from 1.61c to 2.11c. As a result, the board has announced a fully franked interim dividend of 1c per share.

Both our core business and e-health divisions have performed strongly during the first half. This is despite deferred spending by a number of key players in the radiology market who are still in the process of consolidating. The scalability of our products and our continued attention to internal systems and efficiencies have enabled us to extract maximum value from our increase in revenue. This has helped increase the net margin of profit to revenue to 61.0% which has impacted positively on the half year profit figure.

The company saw good uptake of our core products throughout the period as well as the growing trend for the medical industry to adopt promedicus.net as its preferred means of electronically delivering results. Nearly 40% of GPs around the country use promedicus.net, which provides us with an excellent base. Our new developments will allow us to cater for the use of promedicus.net by non-radiology providers. This has the potential to greatly increase the reach of promedicus.net in the medical space. Increased use of promedicus.net by diverse medical businesses will enhance the total value delivered by the service.

Research and development activities advanced substantially throughout this period with good progress made in a number of areas setting a strong foundation for new product releases. In keeping with company policy all R&D costs relating to these development projects were fully expensed.



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Highlights for the half-year include:

#### The Agfa Alliance

Agfa and Pro Medicus are market leaders in their respective fields. The alliance has created a new growth area for the company in digital radiology, a market estimated to be worth more than \$100 million over the next three years. Since announcing the deal in August 2001, Pro Medicus has embarked on a series of new R&D projects related to the alliance. These projects are currently ahead of schedule with commercialisation of the first product anticipated to be in the March/April time frame with revenue flowing from this project in 2002/2003.

#### • Continued growth of promedicus.net

Promedicus.net, the company's e-health offering, continued its strong growth throughout the six-month period. Transmission of radiology results via promedicus.net exceeded the one million mark with transaction volumes growing to over 100,000 transactions per month.

Uptake of the service showed no signs of abating with over 8,000 practitioners Australia-wide – or close to 40% of GP's – now registered to receive diagnostic results via promedicus.net as compared to 7,000 doctors in November 2001. This trend is expected to continue.

#### New opportunities for promedicus.net

The company released technology that enables non-radiology providers, such as locum services, day surgeries and a broad range of specialists, to transmit their results and other medical information to their referrers via promedicus.net. Currently, there are over 16,500 registered specialists in Australia nearly all of whom send a letter back to the referring doctor every time they perform a consultation on a patient.

The first group to adopt this technology, Melbourne Medical Locum Service, which provides after-hour coverage for over 2,000 practitioners throughout Victoria, signed up for the service in November 2001. Other groups are predicted to adopt the service over the coming 6 to 12 months.

#### New core division products

As part of the company's focus on innovation, a number of enhancements to existing products were released throughout the six-month period including "Enterprise Desktop", a leading edge product that provides a single window to all Pro Medicus applications, as well as new versions of the appointments and Practice Management systems.



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The directors believe that the half-year results coupled with a traditional bias towards more activity in the second half leaves the company well positioned for growth in the current financial year.

#### ROUNDING

The amounts contained in this report and in the half-year financial report have been rounded off under the option available to the company under ASIC Class Order 98/100. The company is an entity to which the Class Order applies.

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#### INDEPENDENT REVIEW REPORT

To the members of Pro Medicus Limited

#### Scope

We have reviewed the financial report of Pro Medicus Ltd in the form of Appendix 4B of the Australian Stock Exchange (ASX) Listing Rules, as set out on pages 1 to 17, Attachments A and B, and the Directors' Declaration for the half-year ended 31 December 2001, but excluding the following sections:

- Material factors affecting the revenues and expenses of the economic entity for the current period (page 15); and
- Compliance statement (page 17)

The financial report includes the financial statements of the parent entity, Pro Medicus Limited. The disclosing entity's directors are responsible for the financial report. We have performed an independent review of the financial report in order to state whether, on the basis of the procedures described, anything has come to our attention that would indicate that the financial report is not presented fairly in accordance with Accounting Standard AASB 1029 "Interim Financial Reporting" and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia, statutory requirements and ASX Listing Rules as they relate to Appendix 4B, and in order for the company to lodge the financial report with the Australian Securities and Investments Commission and the ASX.

Our review has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards applicable to review engagements. Our review was limited primarily to inquiries of the entity's personnel and analytical review procedures applied to financial data. These procedures do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, thus the level of assurance provided is less than that given in an audit. We have not performed an audit and accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

#### Review Statement

As a result of our review, we have not become aware of any matter that makes us believe that the half-year financial report, as defined in the scope section, of Pro Medicus Limited is not in accordance with:
